Sunday and Monday, October 10th and 11th, will be two days of hands on woodturning with Mr. Jordan at the Visual Arts Center in Richmond(Main Street). Betsy, in your newsletter article about vacuum chucking (Andy did a very nice job!), you referenced the Beall thread cutters stating their cost was \$45. Actually, they are much less. Because these have a variety of uses (I make all my jam-chucks with them), it's important for your readers to know the actual cost to them. *Including the club discount, the actual cost would be 33MM - \$24.29; 1¼" X 8TPI - \$24.29; 1" X 8TPI - \$16.19.*

There are other sizes available, but these are the most common.
