Making Beads with Deane & Ray

Deane Cox loves his 3-pointed spindle tool (Vertex). To put a bead on the bottom of a big bowl, Deane makes a pencil line first. If it's not even, it will show up in the final shape – no bead. For sanding he folds sandpaper into a point #220. Deane likes the Scotch Brite pads in different colors. Start sanding the bead in the middle, then the left bead, then right bead, repeat.

CHRISTMAS ORNAMENT PROJECT

The Department of Forestry (“DOF”) is celebrating their 100th anniversary and the trees in the Governor’s mansion will feature the Department this year. The DOF serves to protect the very material we use and this is our opportunity to recognize their efforts and say thanks. We agreed to dedicate the November meeting to collecting turned ornaments which should give everyone time to make six each. This will also give us an opportunity to show the public something they might not otherwise see and help promote the club’s existence. Here are the particulars: Each member is being asked to make (turn) six ornaments over the next couple months.

- Each ornament must be made from Virginia woods only.
- Ornaments do not need to be labeled as to the woods included. We will just tell the DOF everything is made from Virginia wood when they are delivered.
- There was a suggestion that ornaments be made larger than normal so they can be seen on a larger tree. While this is true and some should be larger (if you can), there is also visibility in quantity. Therefore, make the size you are comfortable turning.
- Your ornaments are being “loaned” to the department, but we should consider them being donated. If they can be retrieved they will be. Remember, we aren’t the only contributors, things can get lost, broken or misdirected and we can anticipate several volunteers in the process. There are also two trees which can further complicate the issue.
- Each ornament should be ready to hang (string, screw-eye, etc. attached). We don’t need to supply the hooks although I will include a package for their use.
- Three copies of the book “Woodturning Christmas Ornaments” by Dale Nish have been added to our library and are

ready for loan at any time. Just stop in at Woodcraft and sign one out. There is no fee for this and please only keep your borrowed copy for a few days so everyone has a chance to read them. These will permanently be added to our library.

- If you search “turned ornaments” on line and scroll to images of turned ornaments, you will see many ideas. There are also dedicated sites and videos on YouTube.
- If possible, try using contrasting woods in the same ornament. It will make them more visible, especially if not oversized..
- Make the style ornament you are most comfortable making. We don’t have to turn six different ones. If you do make all alike, consider using different woods as this will let each one stand out on its own. Just make ornaments you would be proud to hang on your own tree.
- Any finish can be used – just make it easy on yourself.
- Bring your ornaments to the November meeting. All contributors will be gathered for a group photo to go with the collection. It may not be used, but one never knows.

If everyone participates, we can present over 300 items to be proudly hung on the Governor’s trees. If you have any questions, let me know. Good luck, happy turning and, again, thanks for helping with the cause.
