My tools work fine for me, but the looks on other member's faces told me something was a skewed. All my gouges were pointed and the point wasn't even centered on the tool! (To heavy on one side while sharpening) They now have a more rounded shape. Six stations were set up with each member doing their favorite grind using Wolverine systems to hand & eyeballing. We even had some talks about the theory of sharpening (To hone or not to hone). All in all it ends up being "What-works-for-you". Now if only I can sharpen tools without pointing 'em before the next refresher course.


