Coring Systems with Danny, Jim & Dick

Danny & Wood Cut System (\$290+) used a piece of dry mulberry, not a good choice as bowl coring is usually done on wet wood. This wood bound up a lot and the blank came loose of the chuck each time. This system has a fixed radius with multiple radius cutters (pay for extra radius). Set it up it the center line and it will draw itself into the wood. Hold it back and loosen the lathe belt so it slips and not bind up & burn. The center is waste wood – Save it for fire wood.

Jim & Oneway System (\$300+) used a wet piece of cherry held into a Stronghold chuck. Another fixed radius system but with more play than the

Tool rest, made to fit your machine Woodcut. It has 4 differ-

ent radius cutters, (you pay for each radius) but the tips come off for sharpening. This system comes with its own tool rest and following finger for more support. Cutters are negative rake which makes smooth cuts in end grain. Jim removes the tenon before drying as they tend to crack.

Dick & Following finger tool rest, not in yet McNaugh-

ton System (\$290+) used wet maple and a Triton chuck. This system allows the turners to change the shape of the cores a bit (can't on fixed radius systems, pay for different radius). Dick said throw out the printed instructions and get the DVD. He likes to put a tenon on each end for lining up the cut for another tenon later.

[Demo] Setup the tool rest a hair higher than center, use the tail stock as long as possible. Hold on and don't let the tip drop below center. Open up the cut so the shavings can get out; an air hose can help out here. This system has a negative rake cutter.

As Tenons, remounted with

all new toys there is a learning curve; while at the bottom of it these systems can and will find everything you can possibly do wrong. Wear your safety equipment.
