



Kaleidoscopes With Jim Duxberry

hat a bubbly, happy soul Jim was. Kaleidoscopes are his thing, but he does made puzzles, pens, tops, wine bottle stoppers, PVC bowls, paper-stone, 3-way bowls, turns books and the Resp-O-Rator as seen in catalogs. He has proto types of kaleidoscopes in PVC pipe of 3 mirrors, 4 mirrors, etc. K-scopes have 3 parts: object box, tube, & eye piece.





Jim started making K-scopes kits like all the rest by drilling a 1.5 inch hole, 10

inches deep. As pen turners can attest, it never exits in the center. So Jim can up with a better way: Stave construction with 3 pieces 10 inches long. The hole is ready centered and the sides are at the correct angle for the mirrors. Jim cuts the staves on the table saw at 30°, 50 tooth blade. Staves are glued with yellow glue and held together with hose clamps. To turn a hollow form you have to make a couple of end caps. A block of wood 1: lager than the hollow & 3" long is turned



round; then parted down the center 75% of the way. Remove wood to form 45° angles & part in two. Stick 'em in the ends of the tube and turn between centers; Square up ends, cut tenons on both ends & sand with #80 grit. Mark the eye piece end. From 3 X 3 X 6" blank of contrasting wood turn the eye

piece. Drill a hole, turn a mortise to fit the tenon, turn a recess for the eye piece & part off. Cut some clear glass to fit the recess in the eye piece. Sand, finish & epoxy cement glass into eye piece. [Continued on page 2]

[Demo from page 1] Glue eyepiece on to tube, carefully turn the outside of eye piece. Sand & finish exterior of entire piece. Next, from the remaining block make the revolving cylinder for the other end. This is end grain and must be done right. Face off end. Check depth on tube recess. (can be a little loose, turn in the rain). Put a line there. Notch at the end of depth mark for washers and screws. Expand the hole. Object box is made from PVC coupling 1 1/2" (makes 2). Face off the ends, cut recesses, epoxy in a piece of Plexiglas, add things to the box, epoxy Plexiglas to other side. Drill 1/8" hole into PVC, add glycerin, epoxy hole closed. Cut recess to fit object box. Make a retainer



ring for the rotating cylinder. Mirrors are first surface and you need 3 cut (get a good glass cutter with oil). Tape the mirrors together (silver up), peel off blue cover, fold up and duct tape the whole thing (no finger prints on mirrors). Silicone drops at the end to hold mirrors inside

the tube. Slide on revolving cylinder. Tighten screws with washers (one at a time). Place object box into rotating cylinder, add retaining ring & glue with 4 dabs of Silicone. For more complete directions, order the plans. October's challenge is Kaleidoscopes, so get turning.







Directions to Barbara Dill Phone – 804-749-8565, cell 804-370-7464 16102 Brisbane Hill Lane, Rockville, VA 23146.

On I-64 Take Rockville-Manakin Exit (173) past Short Pump and 288. North (Right going West, Left going East) at top of exit onto Ashland Rd (623). [I-295; Nuckols Road North until it merges with Pouncey Tract (271). You're at the large Church & stoplight). Go about 2.5 miles. Left at next stoplight onto Pouncey Tract (271) (This intersection has large church on right of intersection, country store on far right). Go 1.5 miles from stoplight and stay on Pouncey Tract (Curve to the left immediately after the intersection ...don't make a right onto Howards Mill Road.) Make a right onto Brisbane Hill Lane. The Rockville Community Center is on the far right corner – if you pass it, you've gone too far. take the road to the T at the end. Make a right. Make the immediate left into the driveway – look for the dog flag and the brick pillars. Park in anywhere you can. The shop is behind the house. Google for more info.
