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Bob Rosand's Rube Osolnik Inspired Candleholder

Candleholder has the general form of 1/3 top: 2/3 bottom and the diameter is 2" top and 2.5" bottom. There is also a 1" waste at the bottom. Bob likes the roughing gouge to round up the blank between centers. He then puts a tenon on one end, remounts in a 4 jaw chuck. Mark out the waste at the chuck end, with a parting tool mark out the diameter of the top (2")

and the bottom (2.5"), and mark 1/3 from the top. Rouge in the taper. Taper the end grain a bite. Drill the hole for the candle insert. (Can't find ½" candle insert; 5/8"OD bronze bushing look good, brass tubing, too. Have a candle handy, www.use-enco.com). Part deeper into the

skinny part (~1/4 diameter) and blend in the taper with a spindle gouge. Clean up the bottom and blend in the top & bottom tapers. (Bob makes a set 12", 8", 6") Sand to #600 Chamfer the top with a skew, part off from the waste block. Concave the bottom with

a spade bit using a jig to hold it steady. Wax candles melt or get chewed on by little ones..so make a wooden candlestick. Blank is 3/4 square of contrasting wood and ~12" long (taper is 10"). Using pin jaws mount the blank measure &

mark the diameter of the candle insert. Speed out the taper to the top 2/3. Bring it down to 1/2" and taper to the tail stock. Round up the 1/3 at the head stock to 1/2" mark off 10" and cut off. Mount a

small hole into the top of the candle. Glue a small piece of string into the hole (Wick). Want a whiter look, use 2 part bleach. Make one for the Jan challenge.

Acorn ornament sells for ~\$20. As Bob knows, folks will part with a 20 faster than a 50 dollar bill at craft shows. Body: Start with a 1.25" square about 4" long. Drill a 1/4" hole (lower will be cut off later) for the bird and a 1/16" hole for the perch. Using pin jaws on your chuck mount the square and turn



round with a roughing gouge. With the point at the head stock end, mark the perch hole, shape the blank with a small spindle gouge, but not pass the mark. Drill out the center, and then thin the inside with scrapers. Keep the thickness the same all around. Point the acorn end then cut off. With a skew make a jam chuck out of the waste, attach the nut to the chuck with a drop of medium CA & Accelerator. Finish the bottom, sand and cut off the jam chuck with a skew. Cap: 2" diameter and 1.5" long. Change the jaws, round up the blank and put a tenon on one end. Face the end, concave the bottom slightly, mark the OD of the bottom on the cap end. Remove part of the bottom (reduce the weight), cut a little rabbit for the nut to fit into. An overhang of 1/4" is required; mark the bottom, rough gouge the blank down to the overhang mark. With a spindle gouge shape the cap and round over the edge. Hold a Sorby texturing tool at 45° down and crosshatch the surface. Finish off the cap, part it off, make a jam chuck from the waste and

attach the cap (little spit will make it tight). Smooth out the texture up to the tip. Drill a hanger hole in the tip; add brass screw eye or fishing hook (loop end). Part base off waste block. Make a perch from 1/16" diameter wood.

Ringholder: Starts with a blank 2.5" square by 5" long. Turn between centers with a roughing gouge (good for long flowing curves). Cut a tenon, chuck it and cut the shape of the top & neck. Turn a small concave on the top, drill 1/8" hole, ~2" deep. Sand, cut off, chuck onto a drill bit held in the head stock (engage the wood on the bottom) and shape, cut off the tenon & sand the bottom. Flame: 5/8" square of contrasting wood. Rough out the flame with a chamfer before the tenon. Diameter of the top is the max for the flame. Sand, with calipers measure the diameter of the tenon and make it ~1" long. CA glue in place. 
