


Inside out turned "cats paw leg".


Vought F4U Corsair, WWII vintage fighter plane
I imported pics of Corsairs into Autocad and modeled the plane's components to scale. Wingspan is 15"
Nose section is made of 4 ply poplar,
Fuselage is made of 5 ply poplar using "lost wood technique"
Wings are bent 2 ply poplar using kerf cut bending method.
Tail, wheels and fuel tanks are made of poplar.
Windshield is cast acrylic.
Finish: white undercoat, metallic blue spray, and over 50 coats of semi gloss lacquer.
Decals made using Cricut cutter
Propellers purchased for RC airplanes

Finials similar to Cindy Drozda's. Maple, 5" and 6" high. The black one is spray painted.

Home made vacuum chucks in different diameters and configurations. Most of these chucks use o-rings to seal but also vacuum assisted jam chuck.

Vase 9"x6" found wood, probably spalted poplar, Artisan wood dye. Shellac finish.

Walnut ikebana vase. It was originally turned to a round shape but with the help of a bandsaw, it became a teardrop. The smaller hollowed out circle was turned on an offset parallel axis. I used malachite sand to fill some of the larger cracks and brown medium CA on the smaller cracks. This design was chosen to feature the nice feather grain in the wood. The finish is wipe on poly.




A ring keeper box for the dresser. Finial is South Carolina walnut.



Red Oak shallow bowls. Wood is "cut offs" from Clore Furniture in Madison VA. VERY hard and dry. Finished in Tried and True Danish Oil, buffed and topped with microcrystalline wax.

Walnut, about 8 inches in diameter. The finish is Renaissance wax.
