#### **FEATURE**

Turning a Tippe Top with Neal Bland



After over 40 years of teaching mathematics at the university, I retired. I now have more time to pursue my hobby of turning wood. When making items, I often use mathematics to help design both the item and associated jigs. Items I make and sell include bowls, boxes, vases, pepper mills, spoons, spatulas, tippe tops, kururin sticks, and small animals. I am a member of the American Association of Woodturners, Golden Triangle Woodturners, Woodturners of North Texas, and

Dallas Area Woodturners. I have given more than 30 club demos, some in-person and some remotely. I have also given demonstrations at three Southwest Association of Woodturners symposiums.



#### **Turning Tippe Tops**

In this demo, I show how to turn a tippe top that flips over when given a good spin. This is a fun project for both beginners and experienced turners, requiring only turning beads and simple hollowing. I will show what to do to insure that your tippe top will successfully flip – at least most of the time! I gave this demo at SWAT.



#### President's Corner Steve Kellner

I hope everyone learned something from last month's turner's Talk and feature presentation. The various options for signing our turnings were of definite interest to me since I'm 'penmanship challenged' in the best circumstances let alone with a wood burner! I'll consider some of the alternatives discussed.





This box illustrates chatoyance in highly figured Hawaiian koa wood. Dimensions are 9" x 5" x 4.25" tall. It's finished with five coats of Danish Oil. At about \$150 per board foot (due to this highly figured specimen), this box made better use of the 1 board foot of koa than turning away a lot of material on the lathe. The keys and the inside bottom are walnut.


